Gut Microbiome Altered in Kidney Transplant Recipients

Kidney transplant recipients have an imbalance of gut bacteria marked by a lower diversity of organisms and increased levels of Proteobacteriae such as Escherichia coli compared with healthy renal donors, according to new research presented at Kidney Week 2019.

The study, comparing composition of the gut microbiome in 139 renal transplant recipients and 105 healthy donors, found over 195 significant differences throughout the taxonomy, said lead author J.C. Swarte, PhD, of University Medical Centre Groningen in the Netherlands (Abstract SA-OR103).

Delayed Dialysis Recovery Tied to Frailty

Frailty may prolong recovery from a dialysis session, researchers reported at the American Society of Nephrology's Kidney Week 2019 meeting.

"Recovery time has been associated with downstream outcomes, including worse quality of life and mortality," investigator Jessica Fitzpatrick, MD, PhD, of The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto, told *Renal & Urology News*. "Our results suggest that frail, and particularly younger frail, individuals should be targeted for interventions, such as strength training, to improve hemodialysis recovery times."

Pharmacy Researcher: One Dose Does Not Fit All Dialysis Patients

A new interdisciplinary study looking at therapies prescribed to dialysis patients could have a far-reaching impact on day-to-day protocols.

Dr. Sheryl Zelenitsky, professor and researcher in the <u>College of Pharmacy</u> at the <u>Rady Faculty of Health Sciences</u>, recently received an Allied Health Research Grant from the Kidney Foundation of Canada for \$100,000 to develop dosing recommendations for antibiotics in hemodialysis patients.

Zelenitsky's study aims to optimize the dosing of the antibiotics cefazolin, ceftazidime, and

ciprofloxacin that are commonly used in the treatment of serious, often life-threatening infections in hemodialysis patients. The multi-disciplinary study will see her working collaboratively with nephrologists, renal nurses, and pharmacists at St. Boniface Hospital, where she has a cross appointment.
