In this interactive and case-driven session three such challenging situations will be revisited: patient nonadherence, aggression, and continuation of treatment when it has become overly burdensome. In the absence of easily replicable resolutions to these kinds of issues, this session will examine the complex background against which these circumstances arise. And, it will ask whether—instead of seeing these challenging clinical situations as essentially isolated events—attempting to identify shared underlying and contributing factors might inspire different kinds of creative responses or preventive measures.</p>
